Tyler is the Co-President of the HHS Mock Trial team. Together, they have led the HHS team to the State Tournament, where they placed in the Top 5 out of 355 teams; and one must keep in mind that the HHS team is under 5 years old, and many of the competitors had been in motion for up to 45 years. This is truly a notable achievement.

He is also the Debate Captain of the HHS Speech and Debate team. Next year, he will be leading the entire debate portion of the team. It runs from about November to March, and they attend competitions every Saturday morning from around 8 to about 3. Tyler specializes in the Public Forum category, which tends to host more structured debates on conventional topics.

Tyler also recently spoke to the Hudson Rotary Club about the ethics of the United States as a superpower at their annual Four Way Test Speech Contest. He placed 1st out of 5, and will be moving on to further competition.

He is a member of the National Honor Society, a community only open to Juniors and Seniors with a 3.5 or higher GPA. He is looking at schools in the New England and the Mid-Atlantic regions, such as William and Mary. His presence and leadership on the Mock Trial team has heightened his interest in the field of law, so two of his predicted career paths are Criminal Defense Lawyer or History Professor.

When asked what to tell young Hudson students who wanted to share in his success, he recommended that they "Work Hard, Be Diligent, Be Respectful of Others, and that they must STATE THEIR OPINIONS.
